

Summer Challenge Map and Clues

- 1) This mural honours the twin cities agreement between the people of Stony Plain and Shikaoi Hokkaido Japan. What is it called?
- 2) This living museum reflects local history, Western Canadian pioneer life and is comprised of two historic buildings. Which historic building was erected between 1925 and 1926 and is an exact replica of a building in Scotland?
- 3) Painted by a local artist and members of the Stony Plain Youth, this is the first non-historic mural commissioned. What is its name?
- 4) Stony Plain has a proud history of hosting Citizenship Court in the community and was doing so as early as 1984. In 2014 the Citizenship Ceremony was moved to what location?
- 5) The last remaining wooden structure on the CN Rail line west of Edmonton, it was built in 1958. Operational until 1995, this structure is now a museum. What is the name of the museum?

- 6) This Pre-First World War pioneer home was unique in its size for its time. The home was built with a full concrete basement, a modern sanitation system and a furnace, all rare for 1912 and a farmhouse. What is the name of this historic house?
- 7) Housing a large community fire pit area, splash pad and a winter skating oval, this park also has the Spruce Grove Awards of Excellence recognition feature. What is the name of the park and of the individual who made significant contributions to society in 2009?
- 8) In 1977, 140 acres of marshland were purchased for the purpose of creating a nature sanctuary. As of 1992 the total contiguous area of the sanctuary is 348 acres. What is the name of the sanctuary?
- 9) This recreation area has over 480 acres of woodland and lakes and has a diffused aeration system that was installed in 2016?



- 10) Known as the French Mural Capital of Canada, this town was also recognized as the French Mural Capital of the World (per capita). What is the name of the town? Which famous Canadian peacekeeper is depicted in one of the town's murals?
- 11) It is the home of the annual Fishing Derby and has over 2km of natural walking trails.
- 12) On August 3, 2015 this community became the first community in Canada and the 11th in the world to be awarded recognition as an International Dark Sky Community. What is name of the community?
- 13) The key to this clock is dedicated to the priest for which the town was named.
- 14) This natural area stands out as a microcosm of boreal forest and has varied habitats such as calcareous fens and marl ponds, willow swamps, drier coniferous and deciduous forests, creeks and hay fields. What is the name of the area and who was it named after?
